As a member of ODCC you are expected to abide by the following Colts club rules:

- All junior members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions
- All junior members must respect each other and opponents regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion
- Junior members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late
- Junior members must wear suitable kit, (helmets, boxes, pads, gloves, shoes, whites) for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager
- Junior members must pay any fees for training or events promptly
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club
- Junior members must not use that changing facilities at the same time as adult players unless written consent is given by parents or guardians
- Junior members should not practice in the nets without the supervision by an ECB qualified coach. Neither the Club nor any Committee member or Officer will be held responsible for any injury sustained in such circumstances
- Good behaviour is expected both on and off the field at all times
