Guidelines for dealing with INCIDENTS or ACCIDENTS

- Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation. Is there danger of further injuries?
- Listen to what the injured or affected person is saying.
- Alert a FIRST AIDER if it is an accident who should take appropriate action for minor injuries (details of qualified first aiders can be found on the ODCC notice board). First aid kits can be found in the main club house to the left of the bar and in the home changing rooms.
- In the event of serious injury requiring urgent specialist treatment, call the emergency services on **999** (details are on the ODCC notice board).
- If you're worried about an urgent medical concern, call **111** and speak to a fully trained adviser and they can send out the emergency services if required.
- Details of local hospitals are below if the injury needs hospital treatment but is not urgent.
- Deal with the rest of the group and ensure that they are adequately supervised.
- Do not move someone with major injuries. Wait for the emergency services.
- Contact the injured person's parent or carer.
- Complete an Incident / Accident form, this can be found:
 - In the drawer labelled 'incident / accident forms' in the sideboard found in CC entrance under the main club noticeboard.
